- The Marinus Link a proposed 1500 MW electricity interconnector between Tasmania and Victoria is a nationally significant infrastructure project that will play a pivotal role in Australia's clean energy transition.
- As part of the broader Marinus Project, this critical development will enable greater sharing of renewable energy, unlock investment in new wind and hydro resources in Tasmania, and enhance energy security and reliability for the National Electricity Market.
